

ALL STAR ORGANIZATION



The All Star organization is a program designed to provide recognition and leadership to Sr. High 4-H members (9th-12th graders). The All Star organization encourages service to others through both individual and cooperative efforts. The motto of the All Stars is “Service.”

Some counties use this as a “Senior Honor Club” and actually meet as a county organization on a regular basis. This is done to provide a leadership opportunity for the Senior members without taking any opportunities away from Junior High members.

This organization is organized on the Region level. A Spring and Fall All Star Conference takes place within each Region. For more information concerning regional All Star events and activities, please check out the region related information in the Recognition Programs section in the 4-H Handbook.

Requirements

1. Members must have completed 8th grade.
2. Members must have been approved for Tennessee Honor Club membership by the state 4-H office.
3. Each prospective All Star should submit a report of the member’s community service activity along with a statement of 50 words or less on why membership is desired.
4. Members must be initiated according to the guidelines of the current Regional 4-H All Star Constitution.

State All Star Conference

State All Star Conference takes place at Tennessee 4-H Roundup. All Stars who do not win a scholarship to Roundup may still pay to attend Roundup as an All Star.

High Council

State All Star Officers are elected at State 4-H Roundup in July. A state Chief, Deputy Chief and Scribe will be elected. A person can hold only one position at a time on the State 4-H Council. Therefore, a person can hold only one of the following state offices at any one time: State All Star Chief, State 4-H Congress Governor or State 4-H Council President. All Star Service Award

Each county All Star program wishing to apply for this award should submit the F591 to the Region office. Each county group submitting this report will receive a certificate of recognition.

The Region will select the most outstanding county All-Star organization from region nominations for submission to the state for recognition.

The winner of the State 4-H All Star Service Award will be announced at State 4-H All Star Conference during 4-H Roundup. The winning county will receive a rotating trophy, a plaque and a cash award.
