I selected this charity partly because of its location and mainly because it will help children in our Eastern Region. The Mission of Holston Home for Children is to "provide hope and healing for a brighter future by sharing the love of Jesus with children and families struggling with life's challenges". They do this by:

Check out the next Camp-A-Long coming up May 18th. It will be a great warm-up exercise for camp.


