

The 2024 Eastern Region 4-H Horse Show will be held May 30 – June 1, 2024 at the Roane State Expo Center in Harriman, TN. This email contains all the details you need to prepare your 4-H members for the Region 4-H Horse Show. Please forward the attached Region 4-H Horse Show Entry Packet to your 4-H members and review it to be familiar with the information. The packet includes:

- 1) Letter explaining Region 4-H Horse Show
- 2) Complete Reservation Form
- 3) Horse Show Class List and Keys to Correct Entry
- 4) Regional 4-H Horse Show Entry Form

Deadline for your entries in the online registration database is May 16. 4-H members are instructed in the attached packet to return them to you by May 13. All entries for the Region and State 4-H Horse Shows must be entered online at the same website. Each county is responsible for entering the entry information directly into the on-line database.

Entry fees for the Eastern Region 4-H Horse Show are \$10 per class. The entry forms, complete reservation form, and fees are due to the County Extension Office by May 13. **Entry fees are non-refundable.** Each horse requires a separate entry form. Counties will be invoiced through the county program enhancement account after the region show.

Each 4-H'er requiring a horse stall and/or tack stall will need to fill out a **Complete Reservation Form**. This needs to be submitted when they turn in their show entry form. 4-H'ers must also remit payment for stalls, bedding, and camper hookups to the County Extension Office by the May 13 due date. The Region will invoice each county for these funds at the same time entry fees are invoiced. Bedding can be purchased in advance using the Complete Reservation Form or 4-H'ers can bring their own bedding.

Stalls are \$12 per day per stall. There is no extra fee for arriving the night before a reservation. Bedding is \$8.00 per bale. No money will be accepted for any needs at the horse show. All complete reservation forms should be scanned and emailed to Jamia Long at the Eastern Region Office by May 16.

Anyone arriving at the Region 4-H Horse Show on Wednesday, May 29, should arrive between 4:30 p.m. and 8:30 p.m. for stall access.

SPECIAL NOTES - PLEASE READ CLOSELY

1. All info for the state show will be sent separately.
2. The Tennessee 4-H Horse Championships Handbook will be the guide for the region show. The same eligibility rules apply. To access the handbook, go to:

3. **CLASSES CANNOT BE ADDED AT THE SHOW - DELETIONS ONLY. No refunds will be made for scratched classes.**
4. Make sure you have a "Proof of Negative Coggins" within 12 months of show date. **COGGINS PAPERS WILL BE CHECKED AT CHECK-IN DESK BEFORE YOUR EXHIBITOR NUMBER CAN BE OBTAINED. THE ANIMAL'S NAME ON THE ENTRY FORM SHOULD MATCH THE ANIMAL'S NAME ON THE COGGINS PAPER.**
5. Effective January 1, 2014, all riders, both youth and adult, at 4-H events and activities will be required to wear properly fitted ASTM/SEI-certified helmets with chin straps properly fastened while mounted or while in a vehicle being pulled by equine. Adults must sign a waiver.
6. It is mandatory that members be polite, be good sports and be properly attired. Members are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judge,

to committee members or other officials on the part of the rider, owner, parents or trainer shall disqualify the horse and the 4-H member.

7. RV hookups will be available for \$15 per day. Hookups can be obtained by visiting the stall barn staff at the stall barn area. There will be no show management prior to 4:30 p.m., Wednesday, May 29. No one should arrive before that time.
8. All ponies will be measured EXCEPT those that were six (6) years of age and older and were measured and shown in the Tennessee State 4-H Horse Championships in a previous year.
9. Fire lanes must be kept open surrounding all barns. All vehicles should immediately move to a designated parking area once unloaded.
10. NO DOGS ALLOWED INDOORS or in LINEUP AREAS. Dogs on the premises must be on a leash.

RANCH DIVISION --- KEYS TO CORRECT ENTRY

- R 1 RANCH RIDING CLASSES are not for the normal western pleasure horse. A good using horse is what the judge will be looking for. Everyday working equipment (saddle and bridle) IS PREFERRED. Chaps or chinks are optional equipment. NO BANDING OF MANES FOR RANCH CLASSES. ROPE HALTERS OR PLAIN LEATHER HALTERS CAN BE USED FOR THE CONFORMATION CLASSES.
- R 2 Cannot show two different horses in the same class – even if a single animal is shown one at a time.
- R 3 Refer Tennessee 4-H Horse Championships Handbook for all rules.

- R 4 Split showmanship ring - if class size warrants.
- R 5 TRAIL classes 20 - 24 on Thursday are for horses eligible for Ranch division only.
- R 6 Classes 48 - 52 on Thursday are for horses eligible in Western division only.
- R 7 Riders that enter in Beginner Classes cannot participate in Timed Events (classes 53 – 59)

RANCH HORSEMANSHIP

The Ranch Horsemanship class will be a pattern class. The exact pattern will be determined by the judge, but will contain at least the following:

- 🐾 A large fast circle, a small slow circle in both directions with a simple lead change.
- 🐾 At least one 360 degree turn in each direction, plus a stop and a back.

RANCH HORSE CONFORMATION

The horse will be judged on type and conformation correctness only. Conformation is defined as the physical attributes necessary to perform under saddle. The horse should possess eye appeal with an attractive head; refined throat-latch; well-proportioned trim neck; long sloping shoulder; deep heart girth; short back; strong loin and coupling; long hip and croup. The ideal standard in evaluating horses in conformation should include, but not limited to, soundness and correctness in conformation, particularly feet and legs, with emphasis on correct manner of travel. The horse should show balance and uniform muscling. Horses are not penalized for scars or brands.

Judging Procedure. All entries will enter the arena individually, walking to the judge one at a time. As the horse approaches, the judge will step to the right (left of the horse) to enable the horse to trot straight to a cone placed at 50 feet away. At the cone, the horse will continue trotting, turn to the left and trot towards the left wall or fence of the arena. After trotting, horses will be lined up head to tails for individual inspection by the judge. The judge shall inspect each horse from sides, front and rear.

Equipment. Horses are to be shown in good working halter; rope, braided, nylon or plain leather. Minimum silver will be allowed on halters with the exception of the mandatory buckles. Keepers on open buckles are allowed, and tips are allowed. It is recommended that a horse should be shown as naturally as possible. Banded or braided manes and tail extensions are not allowed.

Ranch Riding

21.3.1. The purpose of the ranch riding class is to measure the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride while being used as a means of conveyance from performing one ranch task to another. The horse should reflect the versatility, attitude and movement of a working ranch horse riding outside the confines of an arena. The horse should be well-trained, relaxed, quiet, soft and cadenced at all gaits. The ideal ranch horse will travel with forward movement and demonstrate an obvious lengthening of stride at extended gaits. The horse can be ridden with light contact or on a relatively loose rein without requiring undue restraint, but not shown on a full drape of reins. The overall manners and responsiveness of the ranch riding horse to make timely transitions in a smooth and correct manner, as well as the quality of the movement are of primary considerations. The ideal VRH ranch riding horse should have a natural ranch horse appearance from head to tail in each maneuver.

21.3.2. Horses shall be shown individually, and the class may be conducted inside or outside of an arena. The pattern may be started either to the right or left direction. Show management has the option to set markers to designate gait changes. If the class is held inside an arena, the course shall be set up to make approximately one pass of the arena in each direction. The optional ranch riding pattern may be used or another pattern may be used as long as all elements of the class are fulfilled as follows:

A. Horses will be shown individually at three gaits; walk, trot and lope in each direction of the arena.

B. Horses will also be asked to reverse, stop and back.

C. The judge must ask for an extended trot and extended lope at least one direction of the ring.

21.3.3. CREDITS AND PENALTIES. Part of the evaluation of this class is on smoothness of transitions. A horse may be collected from the extended trot as the horse moves into the lope. The transition from the extended lope down to the trot is a transition to the seated trot not the extended trot. Therefore, an extra cue to achieve this gait is expected. Horses that complete this total transition within three strides calmly and obediently should be rewarded. Horses that attempt to stop or do stop prior to trotting will be penalized. Judges expect to see horses that have been trained to respond to cues. To see these cues applied discretely and the horse responding correctly could be a credit-earning situation. Maneuver evaluations and penalty applications are to be determined independently. The following penalties will be applied to each occurrence and be deducted from the final score:

A. 1 Point: Over-bridled (per maneuver); out of frame (per maneuver); too slow; break of gait at walk or trot for two (2) strides or less; wrong lead or out of lead for two (2) strides or less.

B. 3 Point: Wrong lead or out of lead for more than two (2) strides; draped reins; break of gait at lope, except when correcting an incorrect lead; break of gait at walk or trot for more than two (2) strides; out of lead or cross-cantering more than two strides when changing leads; trotting more than three strides when making a simple lead change; trotting for more than three (3) strides in lope departures or when exiting a rollback.

C. 5 Point: Spurring in front of cinch; blatant disobedience; use of either hand to instill fear.

D. Off-Pattern (OP): Repeated blatant disobedience; breaking pattern; incomplete maneuver; eliminating or adding maneuvers; use of two hands (except junior and Level 1 horses shown in a snaffle bit/hackamore); more than one finger between split reins or any fingers between romal reins (except in the two-rein). Exhibitors cannot place above others who complete pattern correctly.

E. Disqualification (DQ): Lameness; abuse; illegal equipment; disrespect or misconduct; leaving working area before pattern is complete; improper western attire; fall of horse/rider.

WESTERN DIVISION—KEYS TO CORRECT ENTRY

- W 1 A 4-H'er cannot enter the same horse in Western and Ranch divisions. A different horse must be shown in each of these divisions.
- W 2 WESTERN horse classes for walk, jog & lope are in **BLUE**, Beginner Rider which consist of WALK/TROT classes are in **RED**, PONY classes are in **GREEN**.
- W 3 REMEMBER to only enter the color coded classes for your type of horse(s). For example: You cannot cross enter your horse in WALK/TROT Classes and WALK/JOG/LOPE classes.
- W 4a 4-H'er can only show ONE showmanship horse in each Division.
- W-4b 4-H'er can show in more than one Halter class if their horse meets the requirement of that class (example: horse entered in gelding 5 and under and another horse in halter in gelding over 5), remember - only one horse per class.
- W 5 HALTER and SHOWMANSHIP classes are shown IN-HAND with HALTER typical for that breed.
- W 6 HALTER classes are judged on the horses' conformation and movement only.
- W 7 SHOWMANSHIP and HORSEMANSHIP classes are judged with emphasis on the exhibitor, may have a pattern to perform.
- W 8 RIDING classes are judged with emphasis on the performance of the horse.
- W 9 TRAIL classes 48, 49, 50, 51, & 52 on Thursday are for horses eligible for Western division only.
- W 10 BEGINNER RIDER CLASSES: If 4-H'er enters classes 37, 38, 39, 40, 48, & 49 they are not eligible to enter other classes except in appropriate classes 28-36.
- W 11 All PONY entries must be measured that did not show last year. Measurement records from ponies have been maintained from previous years. A pony measures 58" and under. Ponies will be measured only one time.
- W 12 PONY can be declared a horse and show in horse classes, but they cannot show in both pony and horse classes
- W 13 Cannot show two different horses in the same class – even if single animal at a time.
- W 14 Refer Tennessee 4-H Horse Championships Handbook for all rules.

- W 15 Spilt Showmanship ring – if class size warrants.
- W 16 A MINIATURE horse measures 38' and under.
- W 17 **Contestants must wear protective head gear** (ASTM/SEI certified helmet) with a chin strap securely fastened. Both helmet and harness (chin strap) must fit properly. 4-H'er must furnish safety helmet.

TIMED EVENTS DIVISION KEYS TO CORRECT ENTRY

- TE-1 All horses, regardless of division, are eligible to enter Timed Events Classes as long as they meet the condition keys: TE-2, TE-3.
- TE-2 In BARRELS and POLES, 4-H member must wear appropriate Western tack and attire. **Contestants must wear protective head gear** (ASTM/SEI certified helmet) with a chin strap securely fastened. Both helmet and harness (chin strap) must fit properly. 4-H'er must furnish safety helmet.
- TE-3 4-H'ers entering a beginner class in any division cannot enter Timed Events Classes (56-59). Those beginner classes are:
- Ranch Division Classes: 10, 11, 12, 13, 20, or 21
 - Western Division Classes: 37, 38, 39, 40, 48, or 49
 - Hunter Division Classes: 72, 73, 74, 82, or 83
- TE-4 Cannot show two different horses in the same class.

HUNTER DIVISION KEYS TO CORRECT ENTRY

IF YOU SHOW IN A WALK / TROT CLASS, YOU CANNOT SHOW IN CANTER OR OVER FENCES CLASSES.

- H 1 HUNTER horse classes for walk, trot & canter are in **BLUE**, Beginner Rider which consists of WALK/TROT classes are in **RED**, PONY classes are in **GREEN**.
- H 2 REMEMBER to only enter the color coded classes for your type of horse(s). For example: You cannot cross enter your horse in WALK/TROT Classes and WALK/TROT/CANTER classes.
- H 3 Beginner WALK/TROT exhibitors cannot enter canter/lope classes on a different horse or pony. If you enter classes 72, 73, 74, 82 or 83, the only other classes you can enter are the appropriate showmanship or conformation classes (60-71).
- H 4 4-H'er can only show ONE showmanship horse in each Division.
- H-5 4-H'er can show in more than one conformation class if their horse meets the requirement of that class (example: horse entered in gelding 5 and under and another horse in halter in gelding over 5), remember - only one horse per class.
- H 6 CONFORMATION and SHOWMANSHIP classes are shown IN-HAND with HALTER or BRIDLE typical for that breed.

- H 11 Pony Conformation on Friday is just for Hunter type ponies and should be shown with the appropriate tack and attire.

- H 13 A PONY can be declared a horse and show in horse classes, but they cannot show in both pony and horse classes.
- H 14 If 4-H'er shows in GREEN WORKING HUNTER, they cannot show the same horse or pony in WORKING HUNTER.

- H 16 If 4-H'er enters novice classes (#110 thru 119), they cannot enter classes 120 – 146.

HUNTER DIVISION KEYS TO CORRECT ENTRY (continued)

- H 20 A horse rider combo may enter only one Hunter Hack Class.
- H 21 A horse rider combo may show in only one Working Hunter Class.
- H 22 Novice Hunter - Open to horse/rider combinations who are not capable of jumping fences higher than 2' OR riders who are in their first two years of showing in USEF, IEA or breed shows, and/or the TN State 4-H Horse Show. Horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any Under Saddle, Equitation, Hack or Over Fence class other than Novice. Fence heights 2'. No oxers or in-and-outs.
- H 23 Intermediate Hunter - Open to horse/rider combinations who are not capable of jumping higher than 2' (small/medium ponies), 2'3" (large ponies), or 2'6" (horses) OR riders who have showed more than two years in USEF, IEA or breed shows, and/or the TN State 4-H Horse Show. Open to 4-Hers of any age riding horses or ponies. Horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any Under Saddle, Equitation, Hack or Over Fence class other than Intermediate. Fence heights 2' for Small/Medium; 2'3" for Large Ponies; 2'6" for Horses. No in-and-outs.
- H 24 Junior Hunter Horse – Open to junior 4-H members (grades 4-5) riding horses. Horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any Under Saddle, Equitation, Hack or Over Fence class other than Junior Horse. Fence heights 2'3".
- H 25 Junior High Hunter Horse – Open to junior high 4-H members (grades 6-8) riding horses. Horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any Under Saddle, Equitation, Hack or Over Fence class other than Junior High Horse. Fence heights 3'.
- H 26 Senior Hunter Horse – Open to senior 4-H members (grades 9-12) riding horses. Fences 3'. To be shown over a course of eight jumps. Fences shall simulate obstacles found in the hunting field. Horse/rider combination may not cross enter into any Under Saddle, Equitation, Hack or Over Fence class other than Senior Horse. Fence heights 3

WALKING, RACKING AND SADDLE SEAT DIVISION —Keys to Correct Entry

- T 1 WALKING horse classes are **BLUE**, RACKING horse classes are **RED**, SPOTTED SADDLE horse classes are **BROWN**.
- T 2 **Beginning in 2015, you can cross enter your horse in a Walking Class and a Racking Class if your horse meets the gait requirement of the class.**
- T 3 HALTER and SHOWMANSHIP classes are shown IN-HAND with either HALTER or BRIDLE typical for that breed.
- T 4 GAITED SHOWMANSHIP and HALTER classes are for WALKING, RACKING and SPOTTED SADDLE horses.
- T 5a 4-H'er can only show ONE showmanship horse in each Division.
- T-5b 4-H'er can show in more than one Halter class if their horse meets the requirement of that class (example: horse entered in gelding 5 and under and another horse in halter in gelding over 5), remember - only one horse per class.
- T 6 HALTER classes are judged on the horses' conformation and movement only.
- T 7 SHOWMANSHIP and EQUITATION classes are judged with emphasis on the exhibitor, may have a pattern to perform.

- T 9 COUNTRY PLEASURE is a specialty class for Walking Horses. If you enter Country Pleasure (classes 98 & 99), you cannot show in classes 102-105 on the same horse.

- T 11 In the WALKING/RACKING Division, horses may show with bands except in Western Pleasure (classes 104 & 105) and Walking Pleasure Lite Shod (classes 106 – 107).
- T 12 Any breed or type of horse can show in the RACKING classes as long as they rack and appropriate tack and attire is used.
- T 13 Cannot show two different horses in the same class – even if a single animal is shown one at a time.
