Again, thank you! See you in April in Roane County!



Hello Friends,

It was wonderful to see the turn out of the Eastern Region at the TAFCE Conference. Congratulations to all the winners.

It is important to review the rules for entering articles in Culture Arts. The rules listed on the category form have not changed. I would like to expand on rule number 15. ALL EXHIBITORS MUST BE TAFCE MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING. Every year when the county sends in cultural arts winners to the region, the cultural arts chair sends the list of county winners to the treasurer. The treasurer will check to make sure they are a PAID member. If the exhibitor is not a paid member, then the exhibitor will not be able to compete in the regional competition. The treasurer and cultural arts chair in a last-minute scramble contact the county and give the exhibitor a chance to compete by paying. It is not our desire to disqualify anyone. But on the other hand, we need to keep the competition fair. I am asking the counties do a double check to make sure all exhibitors are PAID members. It is easy to let someone slip by when they start attending meetings after the dues were paid in September. Happy Crafting and looking for to seeing you work in the fall.

Treasury Notes from Marti Agler

Welcome to winter! Does it HAVE to be cold??? By the time you read this, our Financial Year will have ended. A few highlights: We were successful with our Flood Relief Fund, raising \$8,515 plus \$300 in Apple Gift Cards plus a \$25 Master Card Gift Card. In addition, we received 30 blankets and quilts, 100 child and adult pillowcases (for bags), and 1 bag of winter clothes; we ended the year at breakeven (the year-end statement will be provided after 1/1); and ALL our Regional Events paid for themselves! Thank You!!

The Proposed Budget based on 600 members was approved at the Annual Member Meeting at State Conference, That Budget will be a challenge since we have renewed for 2025 at 419 members (at least two counties have still to report).

To address that challenge, a goodly portion of our Spring Event will be a Brain Storming session of identifying common talking points and themes to share with the entire region to use in member retention and

recruitment. This idea came from a member in Roane County, thank you! If you have a member in your county with experience in Marketing, PR, Advertising, or a related field, please send them our way! We will need help developing this campaign and welcome all help! Since we are members, we must think the organization is of value, the trick is to communicate that to others consistently.

Thank you for electing me to serve as your Financial Officer for the last four years. I hope I have been able to establish some procedures that can make TAFCE Eastern Region's financial affairs transparent to all members. We serve on the Regional Board at your pleasure and are always aware of our responsibility to you.

When the floods devastated our East Tennessee neighbors in September, TAFCE Eastern Region moved quickly to determine the status of our members and UT Extension employees in the affected counties. At the Regional Board meeting in October, the Board pledged \$1,000 of unused budgeted funds to begin a Flood Relief Fund for our FCE and UT Extension families.

Thanks to FCE members, clubs, and councils across the state, we collected \$8,515, \$325 in gift cards, 30 quilts and blankets (Houston County), 100 pillowcases (Bedford County), 3 heaters (Sevier County), and 1 bag of warm clothes (Houston County). On Tuesday,

December 16, President Cindy Mishtal, Treasurer Marti Agler, and members of the Johnson County FCE Clubs delivered all items.

Fortunately for the FCE Family, no one had significant losses. Checks were presented to two UT Extension Employees who sustained devastating losses: Sophia Bailey, 4-H Agent, Johnson County and Millie Hanson, Administrative Assistant, Washington County. The goods were donated to Hometown Donation & Distribution Center, Mountain City, TN. This is what we are!
