Exhibitor may tag/enter up to 12 **TOTAL** (combination of gilts/barrows) hogs but can **ONLY BRING and EXHIBIT 6 TOTAL (combination of gilts/barrows) hogs at the show**. All animals listed on the entry forms are subject to the entry fee.

Regional show entry forms and fees should be forwarded separately to the appropriate regional office.

Entry fee checks should be made payable to the University of Tennessee for the correct total.
